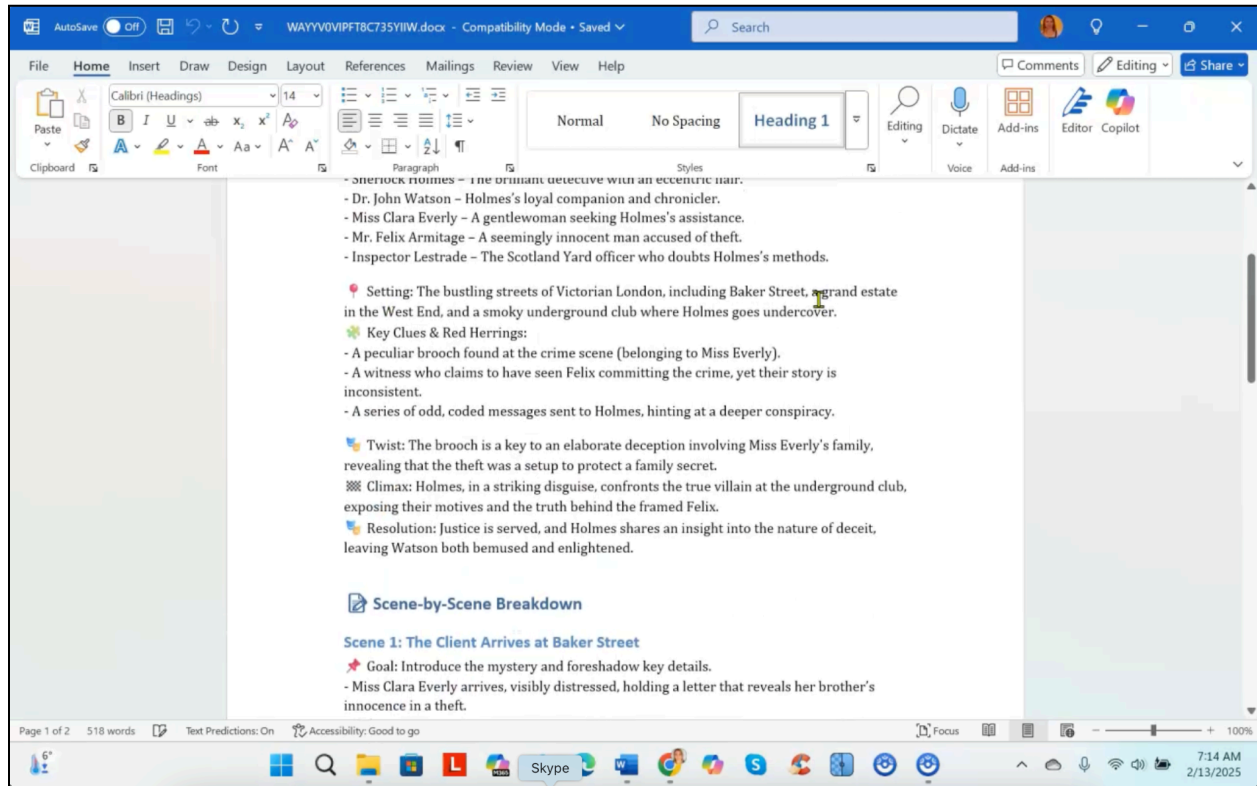


So, I want it to tell me that before, in that scene, before I have to get this, so I don't have to think about that myself. So, here we go. See the origin of the code, the content, it's a substitution
